As of today, (11/20/2020 at 5:00 PM) Gunnison County has been moved in the State's Dial. You can find the official [notice from the State](#) here. This means additional restrictions for the community and our businesses.

We would encourage our community to continue to focus on our local Coronameter system by visiting our [Public Health Order webpage](#). We will continue to update our info with the areas that the state is more restrictive in red strike throughs. *We will discuss these updates and review any additional questions you all may have.*

The following changes will go into effect today:

- All businesses at 50% occupancy or 50 people (up to 100 with space calculator)
- Last call at 11:00 PM
- Gyms and fitness centers to 25% occupancy or 50 people
- Guide Services 50% or 10 people max
- Group Sports limited to 25 persons
- Personal Gatherings no more than 10 indoors or 2 households

Continue our mitigation measures

- Indoor events up to 25 people, Outdoor events up to 50 people
- Event approvals are on hold at this time - the HHS team is reviewing any requests to complete the review and have them ready for a future potential approval
- Recommended 7-day quarantine for anyone traveling out of county for more than 24 hours

## **Additional Business Updates & Resources**

### Rural Relief Small Business Grants

LISC and Lowe's continue to partner on the Rural Relief Small Business Grants. **The next round of applications will be open November 26 – December 2, 2020.** More information can be found [here](#).

This is a continuing grant cycle for small businesses in rural communities (under 50,000 people). Grants range from \$5,000-\$20,000 and can be used for rent and utilities, meeting payroll, paying outstanding debt to vendors, and other immediate operational costs.

### Greenline Emergency Microloan Program

Greenline Ventures seeks to provide funding to small businesses throughout the Western Slope of Colorado to help deal with adverse impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. Businesses must be in the Western Slope of Colorado (with an emphasis for businesses based in Grand Junction) and have fewer than 50 employees. Must be able to show adverse impact from the pandemic. The Microloan Program provides loans on the following terms:

**Loan Amount:** Loans are available for \$10,000 up to \$50,000 **Interest / Amortization:** No interest or principal payments for the first six months, followed by 54 months of level principal and interest payments at a 2% interest rate **Maturity:** 60 months / 5 years **Fees:** There are no fees (application, origination, exit) or prepayment penalties **Collateral:** No collateral requirements.
