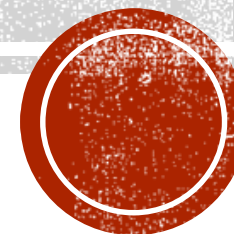

EVENTS & EVENT PLANNER UPDATE

- The events review process will most likely be around until the pandemic response has stopped
 - OR a need for thorough event evaluations is no longer necessary in our community
- In the meantime, we encourage all who are planning events of any size to fill out an ERMA (Event Risk Mitigation Application)
- Currently, all events, regardless of date, will be evaluated for up to 25 indoors and up to 50 outdoors for approval, if occurring in the near future
 - OR, Provisional Approvals are being issued for events that are months away Approvals are for the currently allowed number of 25 indoors/50 outdoors
- A dated time frame to check back with HHS closer to the event date will be provided
 - At this time, the ERMA can be re-evaluated to safely support more attendees, with any modifications needed incorporated into the ERMA for a new approval at a higher capacity
- Food and beverages offered at events will need to follow all restaurant sector guidance, as well as model restaurant style seated service and no mingling of households

TRAVEL RECOMMENDATIONS & GUIDANCE

- Gunnison County continues to recommend that anyone who travels out of the county, for more than 24 hours, quarantine for 7 days upon their return to Gunnison County.
 - We also recommend that visitors who come into the county isolate for 7 days prior to their arrival
- Your workers should follow the guidelines you create for your business environment
- Travel continues to be a high risk of exposure according to contact tracing
- To assess risks associated with travel and gatherings in other communities:

 - The NY Times also has a searchable county by county [exposure map](#)
- The state has updated guidance for individuals that have received two doses of vaccine and 2 weeks have elapsed since the second dose. These individuals will no longer have to follow quarantine protocols when travelling or are exposed to a positive case.
 - Instead these individuals are directed to monitoring for symptoms and isolate and seek testing should any symptoms present
 - Fully vaccinated individuals are still required to follow the [Seven Commitments of Containment](#)

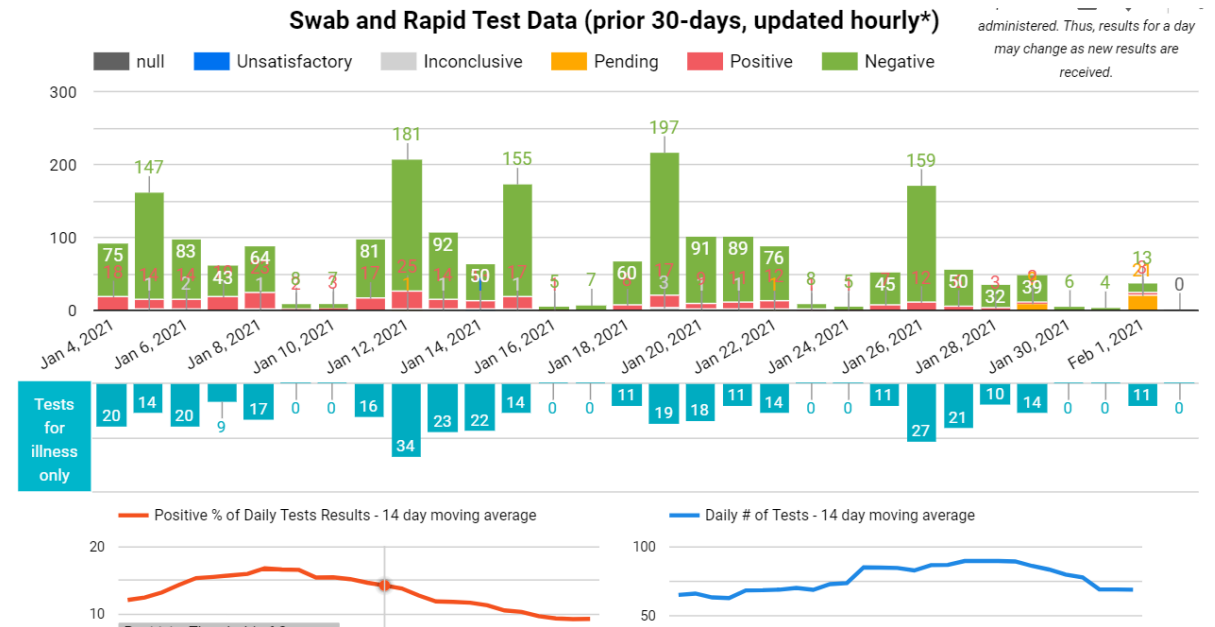


RETAIL FOOD LICENSE UPDATE

- Jenn Chavez sent out information to all retail food license holders on 2/1/21 via e-mail
- **All 2021 retail food licenses/invoices have been mailed to accounts receivable mailing address on file**
- Those who qualified for the waiver from SB20D-001 should receive their license in 7-10 days
 - Haven't received by Valentine's Day? Contact Jenn.
- Those who did not qualify and have not yet paid the license fee it is now passed due
- Please make payment ASAP to avoid civil penalty for operating without a license



PUBLIC HEALTH UPDATES



- As of this morning, Gunnison County has 1,113 positive tests, 10,826 negative and 30 pending test
- Positivity around 10%
- Continue to meet 2-7 indicators for a move to Yellow on the Coronameter
- Case incidence rates continue to be high in ski resort communities
- The State is monitoring data in these communities to determine if additional mitigation is needed



ADDITIONAL PUBLIC HEALTH INFO

Colorado COVID-19 Dial


- We anticipate the State will be updating the Dial system
- At this time we do not anticipate it will change restrictions within the color-coded levels
- It will likely change the thresholds for the metrics around hospitalizations, case counts, and positivity of tests
- We hope to know more on these finalized changes later this week
