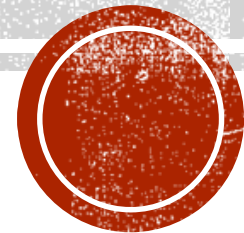

OPERATIONS POST THE DIAL

CURRENT STATUS: BLUE

HYGIENE AND SOCIAL DISTANCING REQUIREMENTS

- 1.** Maintain 6ft. of social distance.
- 2.** Regular cleaning of high-touch surfaces.
- 3.** Mask wearing indoors and when social distancing cannot be followed.
- 4.** Employers required to screen employees for symptoms of COVID-19.
- 5.** Isolate and get tested if sick or in contact with someone who is sick.

AT-RISK (age 65+ and those with underlying medical conditions) : **OPEN**

- State devolved the Dial and asked local jurisdictions to make appropriate regulation
 - 1/3 of Colorado counties created their own public health orders or continuing a modified version of the Dial
- Gunnison County businesses operating at the Blue Level without additional State restrictions
- Necessary to continue the hygiene and social distance requirements in ALL OPERATIONS
 - This includes facial coverings indoors and where 6 feet can not be maintained
- Social distancing requirements will limit occupancy in some settings
- Restaurants/bars continue to use a partition for service at bar or seating configurations with less than 6 feet
- ERMA approval still required for Events with Blue Level group size restrictions



WHEN WE GET TO GREEN

- Businesses, non-profits, etc. all return to routine business operations
 - Social distancing, extra hygiene protocols, and employee symptom logs are no longer necessary
 - These may remain a best practice
 - Gunnison County's facial covering requirement continues through the end of the Public Health Order on 7/1/21

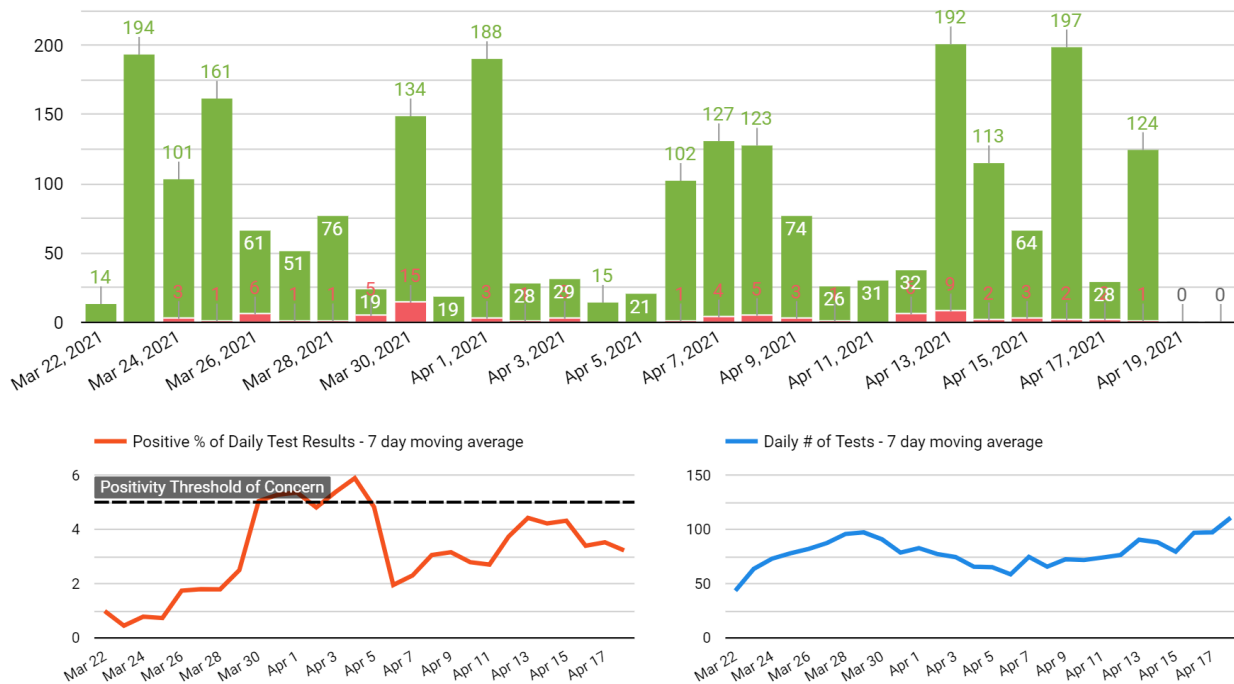

CURRENT PUBLIC HEALTH NUMBERS



- Continuing to see positive results
- Routinely seeing three or more days with 3+ positives in a week
- In the last 7 days, 25 positives
- Case investigations reveal patterns with travel continue and exposure by other members of the household

- As of 4/19/21:
- We have 7,542 Gunnison County residents fully vaccinated
 - We have just over 9,300 residents who have received at least one shot
 - We need to finish the vaccine sequence for these individuals and deliver vaccine to approximately 700 new individuals
- 10,000 fully vaccinated Gunnison County residents means Coronameter Green



VACCINE WALK-INS

- Starting on Thursday (4/22) all of our vaccine clinics will accept walk-ins
 - Registration will occur on-site
 - Those interested in receiving a shot without an appointment
 - Daily availability of vaccine may limit some walk-ups
- We are also planning a Saturday walk-in clinic in Crested Butte for 5/1/21
 - More information to come
- If you received a vaccination elsewhere in the State it is accounted for in the Colorado Immunization Information System
- Those who were vaccinated out of State will need to bring their vaccination card/record to HHS to be added to the Colorado Immunization Information System



RESTAURANT REVITALIZATION FUND

- Restaurant Revitalization Fund has released more information [here](#)
 - Open to restaurants that opened between 1/1/20 and 3/10/21
- Required application info will include IRS Form 4506-T and Gross Receipts Documentation. Acceptable documents found [here](#)
- First 21 days of application for priority groups and those in the following revenue categories
 - \$5 billion is set aside for applicants with 2019 gross receipts of not more than \$500,000
 - An additional \$4 billion is set-aside for applicants with 2019 gross receipts from \$500,001 to \$1,500,000
 - An additional \$500 million is set-aside for applicants with 2019 gross receipts of not more than \$50,000
